1 HB 1069 (final passage)—**Requiring performance audits for tax preferences.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 63-32, Feb. 7.)

2 HB 1515 (final passage)—**Civil rights bill** barring employment and housing discrimination based on sexual orientation. “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 61-37, Feb. 11.)

3 SSB 5097 (final passage)—Requiring 15% **apprenticeship utilization** at major public works projects. “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 58-40, Feb. 16.)

4 HB 1557 (final passage)—Expanding the **Electrical Board** to include an outside lineman. “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 66-32, March 8.)

5 HB 1096 (final passage)—Requiring a **tax expenditure report** as part of biennial budget documents. “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 64-34, March 8.)

6 HB 1636 (final passage)—Establishing a **childcare career and wage ladder.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 59-34, March 11.)

7 HB 2257 (final passage)—**Requiring state contracts to be in the state’s best interest.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 61-35, March 16.)

8 HB 2255 (final passage)—Restoring two-quarter averaging and liberal construction to **Unemployment Insurance.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 56-41 on April 1.)

9 SSB 5471 (final passage)—Expanding the state’s **prescription drug purchasing consortium.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 56-42, April 6.)

10 SJM 8014 (final passage)—**Opposing Social Security privatization.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 56-41, April 12.)

11 ESSB 5034 (final passage)—Restoring the “**affiliation rule**” on campaign contribution limits. “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 56-40, April 13.)

12 SSB 5720 (final passage)—**Barring employee non-compete agreements** in the broadcasting industry. “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 56-40, April 13.)

13 SSB 5850 (final passage)—**Expanding family care coverage.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 58-38, April 14.)

14 SSB 6103 (final passage)—**Transportation funding.** “Right” vote: YES. (Passed 54-43, April 24.)

- 1** SSB 5097 (final passage)—Requiring **apprenticeship utilization** at major public works projects. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 27-19, Feb. 2.)
- 2** SSB 5471 (final passage)—Establishing the **prescription drug purchasing consortium**. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 25-24, March 10.)
- 3** SJM 8014 (final passage)—A resolution **opposing Social Security privatization**. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 25-23, March 14.)
- 4** E2SSB 5069 (final passage)—Establishing **family leave insurance**, paid leave to care for new children or care for sick family members. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 26-21, March 15.)
- 5** SB 5720 (final passage)—**Barring employee non-compete agreements** in broadcasting. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 26-22, March 16.)
- 6** HB 1636 (final passage)—Establishing a **childcare career and wage ladder**. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 27-22, April 7.)
- 7** HB 1557 (final passage)—**Expanding the Electrical Board** to add an outside lineman. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 30-16, April 15.)
- 8** HB 2255 (Parlette striker) — An amendment to kill the **Unemployment Insurance** bill. "Right" vote: NO. (Failed 23-25, April 15.)
- 9** HB 2255 (final passage)—Restoring two-quarter averaging and liberal construction to **Unemployment Insurance**. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 25-20, April 15.)
- 10** ESSB 5034 (final passage)—Restoring the "**affiliation rule**" for campaign contribution limits. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 26-20, April 20.)
- 11** SSB 6103 (final passage)—**Transportation funding** for some \$8.5 billion in projects. "Right" vote: YES. (Passed 26-22, April 20.)
- 12** HB 1515 (final passage)—**Civil rights bill** barring employment and housing discrimination based on sexual orientation. "Right" vote: YES. (Failed 24-25, April 21.)
