Strengthen safety net for laid-off workers.

Working people are suffering long-term unemployment because of a recession caused by corporate greed and malfeasance. Rep. Tami Green co-sponsored legislation to expand unemployment insurance eligibility to cover more families suffering layoffs and to stimulate our state economy.



Create green jobs in construction industry.

Rep. Green co-sponsored the Jobs Act of 2010 to seek voter approval to issue \$505 million in bonds for energy repair and retrofitting work at public schools, state colleges and universities, and other public facilities. It will create about 30,000 jobs in hard-hit construction industry in every corner of the state.



Protect family-wage jobs.

Rep. Green fought efforts by conservative legislators to privatize government services—effectively replacing good family-wage public jobs with low-pay, low-benefit jobs—without any assurance the state would save money. For example, Green voted against replacing family-wage liquor store jobs with private-sector jobs likely to pay minimum wage with few or no benefits.
