## VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

1. SB 5161—Repealing the state ergonomic workplace safety rule. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 30-19 on Feb. 18.)
2. SB 5271—Restricting workers' compensation hearing loss claims. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 28-21 on Feb. 18.)
3. SB 5697—Restricting inflationary increases in the minimum wage. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 25-24 on Mar. 12.)
4. SB 5378—Reducing workers' compensation time-loss benefits. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 25-24 on Mar. 12.)
5. SB 5971—Closing Fircrest School for developmentally disabled. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 37-12 on Mar. 14.)
6. SB 5053—Prohibiting rules that exceed federal standards. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 25-24 on Mar. 18.)
7. SB 5890—Studying whether court-mandated medical monitoring of pesticide-exposed farm workers is needed. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 32-17 on Mar. 18.)
8. SB 5462—Adopting federal definitions for state wage and hour laws. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 25-24 on Mar. 18.)
9. SB 5522—Creating pilot project for privatizing state liquor retailing. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 29-20 on Mar. 19.)
10. SB 5404—2003-05 Operating Budget (regular session) with no public employee pay raises, fails to approve home-care workers' contract and unacceptable human services cuts. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 28-20-1 on Apr. 4.)
11. HB 2231—Transportation funding/5-cent gas tax increase. "Right" vote was YES. (Passed 38-11 on Apr. 26.)
12. SB 5404—2003-05 Operating Budget (special session) essentially the same as the budget in Vote 10. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 28-19-2 on Jun. 5.)
13. SB 6059—Suspending I-732 COLAs for teachers and school workers. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 26-20-3 on Jun. 4.)
14. SB 5012—Authorizing charter schools. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 27-19-3 on Jun. 10.)
15. SB 6097—Unemployment Insurance "reform." "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 33-12-4 on Jun 10.)

## VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

- HB 1214—Original bill creating a prescription drug purchasing pool to negotiate lower prices. "Right" vote was YES. (Passed 64-33, Feb. 7.)
- HB 1869—Priest amendment to gut bill requiring performance audits of tax breaks. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 51-47, Mar. 18.)
- HB 1065—Creating apprenticeship opportunities at public works projects. "Right" vote was YES. (Passed 52-45, Mar. 19.)
- SB 5404—2003-05 Operating Budget (regular session) with one-time raise for public employees, honoring the home-care contract and mitigating human services cuts. "Right" vote was YES. (Passed 52-46, Apr. 26.)
- HB 2267—Providing revenue for schools and Basic Health Plan. "Right" vote was YES. (Passed 50-48, Apr. 26.)
- HB 2231—Transportation funding/5-cent gas tax increase. "Right" vote was YES. (Passed 60-38, Apr. 26.)
- SB 5404—2003-05 Operating Budget (special session) with no public employee raises, failure to honor home-care contract and unacceptable human services cuts. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 67-30-1, Jun 5.)
- SB 6059—Suspending I-732 COLAs for teachers and school workers. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 59-33-6, Jun. 9.)
- SB 5271—Restricting workers' compensation hearing loss claims. "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 69-21-8, Jun. 11.)
- SB 6097—Unemployment Insurance "reform." "Right" vote was NO. (Passed 57-33-8, Jun. 11.)
