X Mark Mullet is a business owner who has been a State Senator for eight years. During that time, he has sided with corporate interests over working families on some important issues.

DENY NURSES REST BREAKS — Mullet sided with Republicans in voting to exempt rural hospitals from requiring rest and meal breaks for nurses.¹

WRONG ON EDUCATION — Mullet voted for larger class sizes,² and to divert education money to private charter schools that lack sufficient public accountability.³

BLOCK AFFORDABLE HOUSING — Mullet voted against allowing local governments to apply sales and use taxes to fund affordable housing in their communities.⁴

DISCRIMINATION — Mullet was the only Democrat (out of 29) in the State Senate who voted against Initiative 1000 to promote equal opportunity in public employment, contracting and education.⁵ King County voters later voted 63% to 37% in support of that measure.⁶
