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Do you know what to do if you're injured on the job?

At work, you hurt your back lifting something. Alternatively, maybe you tripped and crashed down hard to the floor, or gave yourself a horrid laceration and need stitches. You're mortified. Maybe you caused the incident, maybe you didn't, but your boss might not think so. Well it doesn't matter if it was your fault, your employer's fault, or nobody's fault: Washington State workers' compensation is a "no-fault" system to help you when you've suffered an occupational disease or a work-related injury.



You have the right...

You have the right to file a claim. Your employer must take you to medical care if you are in need of emergent care. You have the right to choose your own medical provider from L&I's Medical Provider Network. Here is what you do: 1) Notify your employer, 2) Get first aid or medical attention, 3) file a claim, and follow up, 4) If you disagree with a decision you can dispute an action, protest and or appeal a decision.
