Jay Inslee has served two terms as Governor. Prior to that he served in Congress, representing districts in both Eastern and Western Washington and earning a 91% voting record on working families' issues.¹

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, Inslee has used every tool at his disposal as governor to **protect the safety of those working** on the front lines and to **assist those who have lost their jobs**. He ordered unemployment and sick leave protections, eviction bans, rent freezes, and other measures to assist families during the pandemic.²

Inslee says **his top priority our state's economic recovery**.² In his first term, he led Washington out of the Great Recession. By his second term, he brought Washington together to create what CNBC rated the top state for businesses and Oxfam declared the best state for workers.

Inslee is a **strong supporter of unions**,³ and has signed legislation to protect prevailing wage standards, promote apprenticeship opportunities, increase minimum wages, ensure paid sick leave, and create Washington's groundbreaking paid Family and Medical Leave program.³

Loren
Culp

Loren Culp is police chief of Republic, a small mining town (pop. 1,000) in northeast Washington. In that role, he manages a department that consists of himself and one other officer.⁴

A strong supporter of Donald Trump, Culp has held multiple campaign rallies with **hundreds of unmasked supporters in violation of the state COVID restrictions**.⁵ Contrary to medical and public health recommendations, he says he'd end mask requirements and business restrictions meant to slow the spread of COVID-19.⁶

Culp's claim to fame is that he **refuses to enforce a voter-approved gun law**. He won't enforce I-1639, which nearly 60% of Washington voters approved, requiring enhanced background checks for firearm purchases and banning people under 21 from buying semiautomatic rifles. Culp says it's unconstitutional. The courts disagree.⁷

Culp has almost **no public administration experience**. He first became a police officer 10 years ago at age 49, and has only managed a department of two people.⁴
