

NEED CHILD CARE? YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR HELP WITH THE COST!

Working Connections Child Care (WCCC) is a Washington State program to help families pay for child care. High quality child care can help set your children up for success in kindergarten and beyond.

Eligibility is based on your family's monthly income. If you qualify, the state will pay for the cost of your child's care at a licensed family home or center. You may be responsible for a co-pay of up to \$115 a month through July 1, 2023.

Additional eligibility requirements:

- The child must be a U.S. citizen or legal resident.
- The family must live in Washington state.
- Parent(s) must be employed or self-employed in legal, income-generating, taxable activities; or parent must meet all TANF/WorkFirst requirements if participating in that program.
- Starting July 1, 2021, parents attending full-time community, technical, or tribal college are no longer required to work to qualify for WCCC. Student parents enrolled full-time may be eligible for WCCC when participating in associate degree programs, vocational educational programs that lead to degrees in specific occupations or registered apprenticeships.

How to apply:

- Contact the Child Care Subsidy Contact Center at 1-844-626-8687 or apply online at www.washingtonconnection.org
- You will need to provide Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) with the following information:
 - Proof of your child's citizenship or legal residency (via passport, birth certificate, or Social Security Number)
 - Household members
 - Household income (via paystubs or other proof)
 - The name and phone number of the child care provider (if you already have someone who's agreed to care for your child. If not, you can still apply, but you'll need to report the provider information to DCYF prior to beginning care.)
